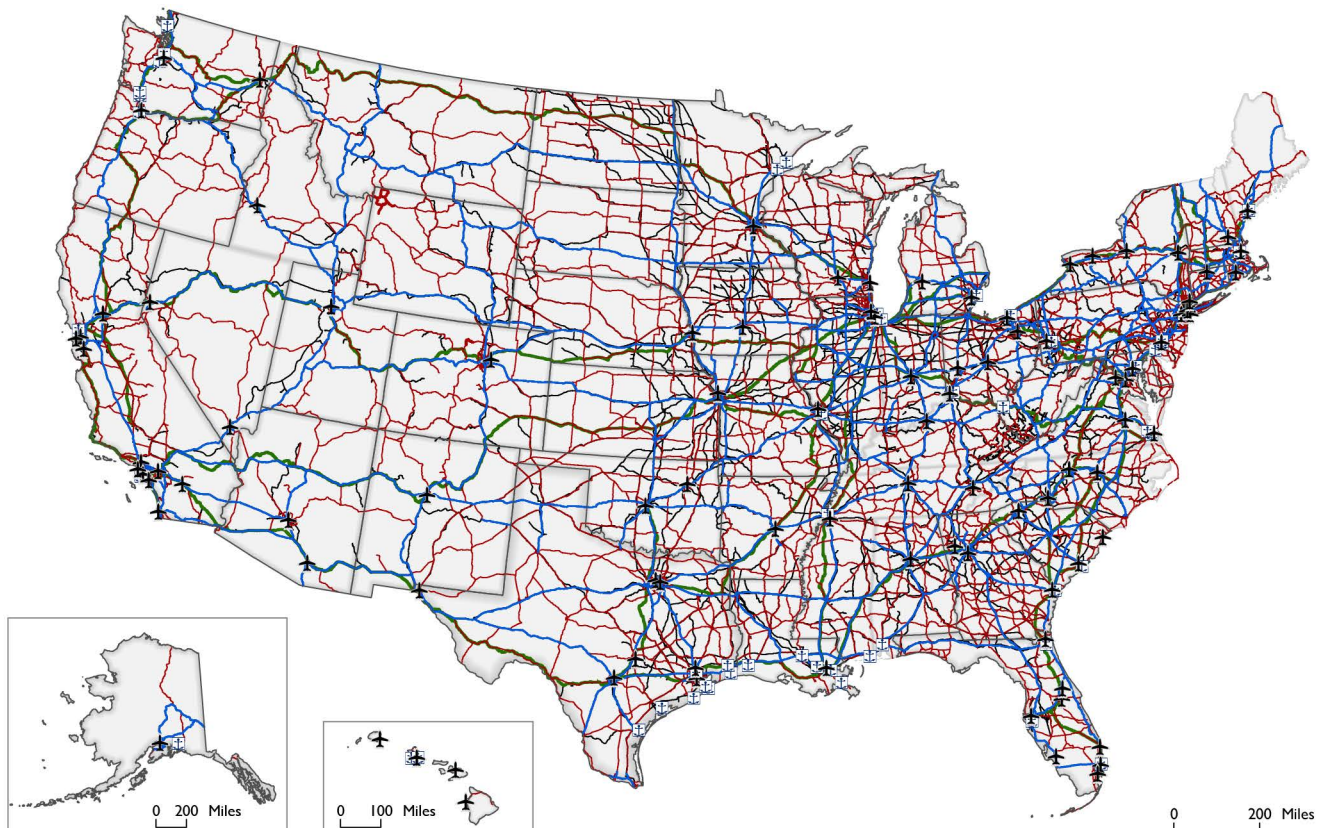

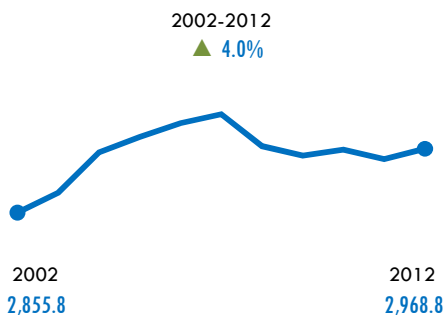

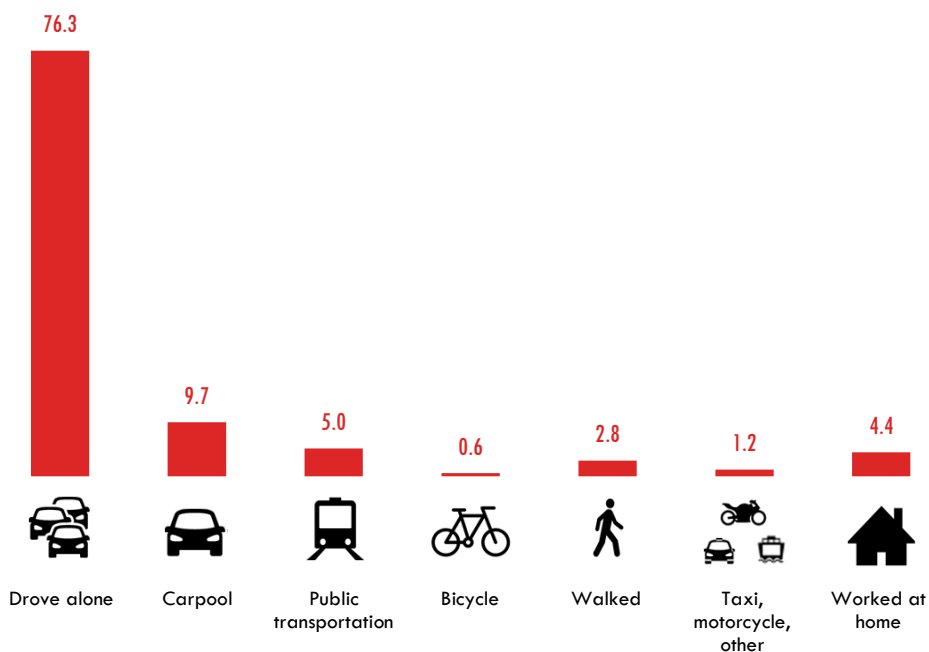
HIGHWAY TRAVEL

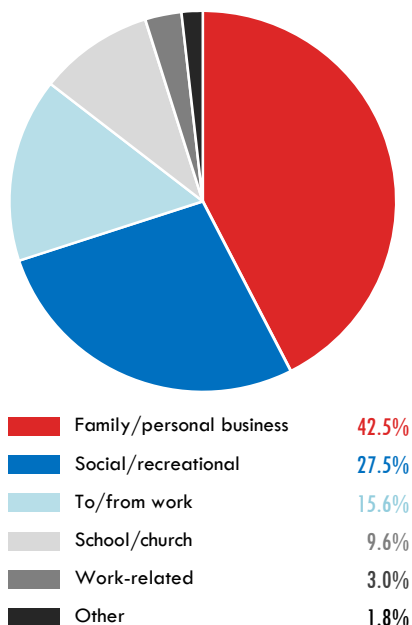
AVERAGE DAILY PERSON TRIPS

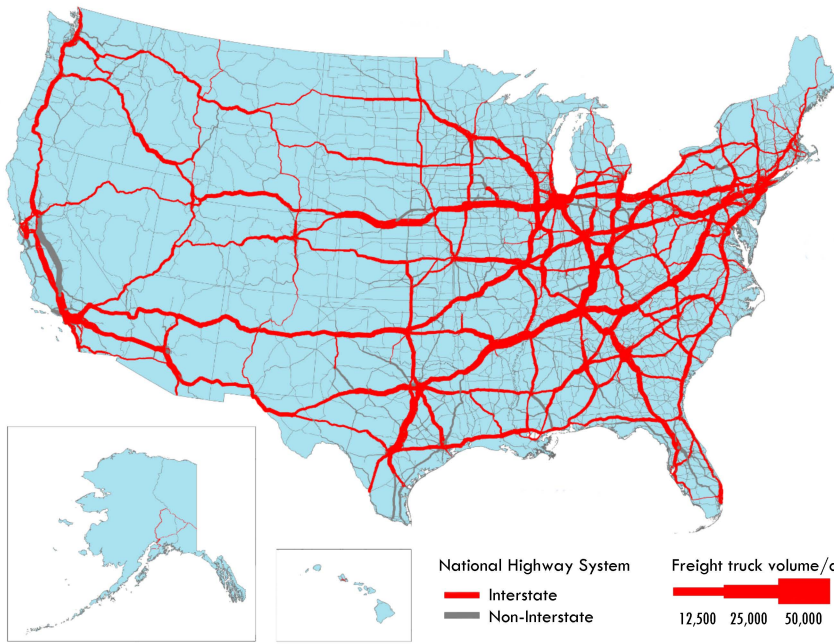

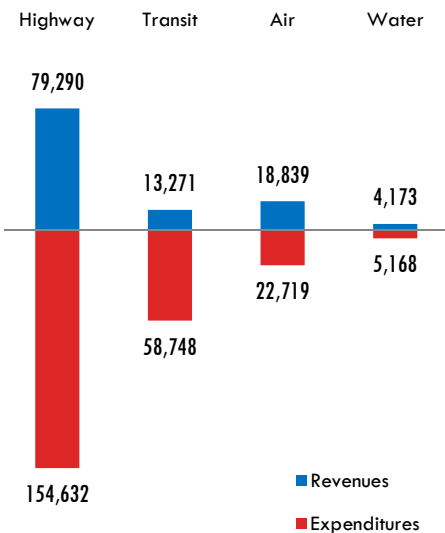

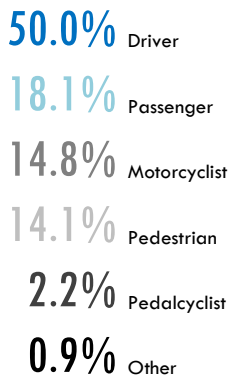
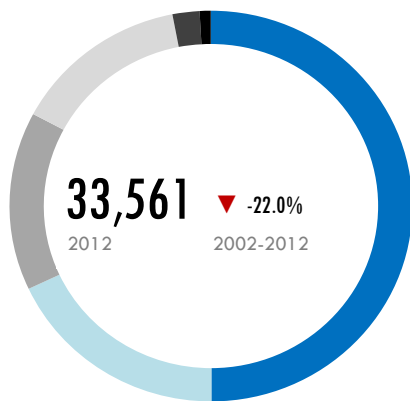

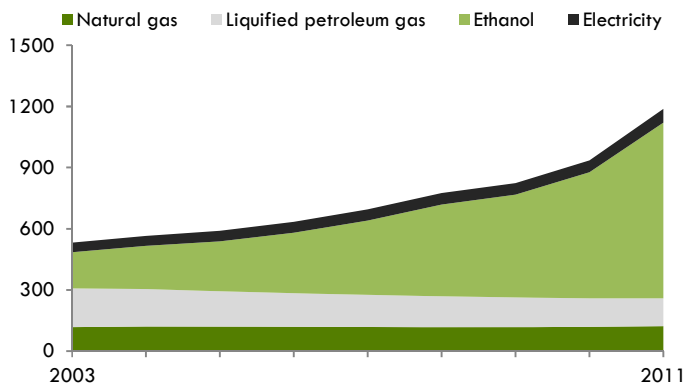

Thousands of vehicles, 2003-2011



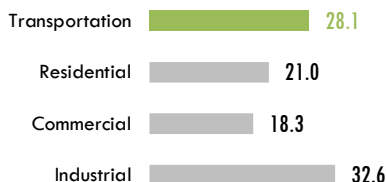
HIGHWAY FATALITY RATE

Fatalities per 100 million vehicle miles traveled, 2012



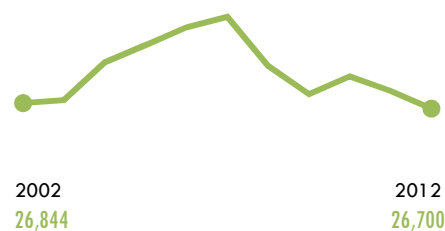
ENERGY USE BY SECTOR

Trillion Btu consumed, 2002-2012

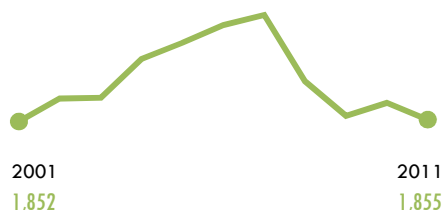

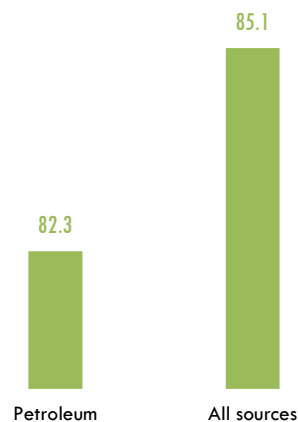
TRANSPORTATION EMISSIONS
